



Know Your Rights as an Oregon Voter.

An Important Message from the Oregon Secretary of State and Your County Elections Official

You have the right to vote freely, safely, and privately.

Your rights as a voter:

You have the right to:

- Access official ballot boxes and election offices without interference.
- Keep your vote private.
- Vote without intimidation, harassment, or threats.

Voter intimidation is illegal. It may look like:

- **Aggressive or harassing questions** meant to interfere with your right to vote or pressure you to vote a certain way, including questions about your citizenship status, criminal record, residency, personal information, or how you plan to vote.
- **False or misleading statements** about voter fraud, eligibility, or criminal penalties meant to scare or deter you from voting.
- **Verbal or physical threats**, whether explicit or implied, meant to stop you from voting or force you to vote for a particular candidate or measure.
- **Blocking, obstructing, or interfering** with your ability to cast your ballot.
- **Targeted surveillance of voters or groups of voters**, such as following or tracking voters, recording license plates, taking videos or photos, etc., with the intent to discourage or interfere with voting.

If your rights are violated:
