**Park Reservations:**

1. Camping reservations will be accepted and processed through a website. Reservations will not be accepted by phone, fax or email. Reservations may be made in person directly with the Park Manager.
2. A person must be 18 years of age or older to make a reservation. An adult must accompany minors at the campsite.
3. A person who qualifies under the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) may reserve accessible campsites.
4. Reservations may be made 12 months / 1 year in advance of arrival. Reservations longer than one year prior to arrival will be limited to groups or special events upon permission of the Park manager.
5. When making reservations on the website, "Guest information" must be for the person(s) staying and occupying the campsite. Name, address and phone number for credit card information can be different. If the guest information is not accurate upon arrival, the reservation may be cancelled by the Park Manager. Campsites may not be transferred or sold. Only guest listed on the reservation or the person named on the credit card may cancel the reservation. Guest(s) on the reservation are responsible for all activities and damages of all users at the campsite. If making reservations for guests, please make sure guests are informed of these Park rules. Specific information regarding a confirmed reservation will not be released to the public.
6. A person excluded from the Park may have reservations cancelled and may not make additional reservations during the exclusion period.
7. Check in and Check out is 12:00 p.m. (noon). Guests with confirmed reservations must arrive before 12:00 p.m. (noon) the day following the first scheduled day of their reservation. Guests who do not check-in or notify Park staff that they will be delayed prior to noon check in on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of a confirmed reservation will be considered a "no show" and the entire reservation will be cancelled. All camping fees previously collected for the reservation will be retained.
8. Each camp site is \$25.00 a day and includes one camper/RV/ motorhome **or** tent. Additional tents at one site are \$10.00 per day per tent. Tents can be on the grass but must

be moved the morning of every 3<sup>rd</sup> day to maintain the grass areas. The camping fee includes RV dumping.

9. Refunds will only be provided if changed or cancelled at least 48 hours in advance of arrival. Cancellations less than 48 hours in advance of arrival, will not be issued a refund. Cancellations must be done through the website. Cancellations will not be accepted by phone or email.

**10. Recreational Immunity.** The State of Oregon Recreational Immunity Law (Oregon Public Use of Land Act ORS 105.676-105.688) generally protects the County from liability/negligent claims if a person is injured while using Bully Creek Park for recreational purposes at no charge. Camping and RV dumping are the only charges at Bully Creek Park. Covered activities at no charge include, but are not limited to: boating, swimming, walking, running, biking, hiking, activities in day use areas, picnicking, and fishing. Recreational immunity applies to both improved and unimproved areas and trails.

**11. Arsenic Warning. The Park water system violates drinking water standards and arsenic levels are above the acute level for children. Arsenic in drinking water is a serious health concern. Do not drink, or boil the Park water. Do not wash, prepare or cook your food with Park water. Do not let your pets drink the Park water. Water may be used for bathing, laundry and washing dishes, utensils and food preparation areas. **Camping:**

12. Speed limit in the park is 10 m.p.h.

13. Vehicles and trailers are not to be on the grass. Vehicles must stay on the gravel roads and in a parking area.

14. ATVs are not to be operated in the Park at any time, except to park, load or unload the ATV at your campsite. Parking, loading and unloading of an ATV in the Park must occur between dawn and dusk.

15. Quiet hours are dusk to dawn.

16. Stays are limited to 14 days. Exceeding this stay limit or leaving personal property unattended can result in your property being seized, towed and disposed of by Malheur County. It can also result in criminal trespass charges.

17. Day use areas are open from dawn to dusk.
18. Persons under 16 years of age are required to wear protective headgear as provided by ORS 814.487 and ORS 814.534 if operating a bicycle, electric bike, skateboard, scooter, roller or in-line skates or other wheeled, operator-propelled equipment in the Park.
19. An individual under age 21 may not possess or consume alcohol. No open container or walking around the Park while consuming alcohol. A person may use or possess alcoholic beverages in the boundaries of their reserved campsite.
20. Smoking, manufacturing and distributing cannabis is prohibited in the Park.
21. Pets. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Pets must be under the control of the owner at all times and never left unattended – including kenneled at the campsite. Please clean up after your pet by removing and properly disposing of excrement and other solid waste of your pet.
22. Metal detecting and use of drones is prohibited.
23. Camp and picnic tables must be returned to their original location prior to check-out.
24. All trash, refuse, and rubbish shall be disposed of in provided receptacles. Do not burn trash. Human waste and grey water are to be disposed of at the RV dumping station.
25. Fires are permitted in fire rings only. Please extinguish fires after each use. Bring in your own firewood. Severing, cutting or removing any tree, shrub or flower at the Park is prohibited.
26. No firearms, destructive weapon, explosive or bows are to be discharged in the Park.
27. No fireworks, sparklers, snakes, smoke or fire producing items are to be discharged, thrown or placed on the ground in the Park.
28. Avoid reckless behavior, pushing, horseplay, fighting or bullying. Any activity that could jeopardize the safety of others is prohibited.
29. No signs, swings, ropes, hammocks, flags, posters etc. are to be attached to any structure or tree.
31. Livestock is not allowed in the Park.
32. Selling concessions are not permitted at the Park.
33. Additional rules may be posted at the Park. Please look for them.

**Other:**

34. No person shall swim or water-ski from the boat moorage docks or in the area of the location of the boat launch ramp and dock bounded by the shoreline, marked by buoys parallel to the shoreline, by the swimming area and by marker buoys perpendicular to the shoreline.

**Violations and Enforcement:**

Generally, a violation of these rules is a Class A infraction under the Malheur County Code and can result in a fine of up to \$500; each subsequent violation is a fine of up to \$1000. Violations of these rules may also lead to removal and exclusion from the Park, and a civil action against you for any and all damages done to Park property. A citation for noncompliance with State laws can be issued by law enforcement.
